

SCHOLARSHIP ON THE MOVE

Often in the context of a social fraternity, academics are given the backseat to social functions. The brothers of Connecticut Alpha are striving to keep academic priorities in the forefront, and last semester was no exception. Adam Adelkopf, now a senior engineering student, was awarded the Connecticut Alpha Scholarship-Leadership Award. This award signified Adam as the winner of the \$250 scholarship which goes to an outstanding Junior in the chapter in the area of academics.

Along with the award, the chapter also improved elsewhere on the academic front. The chapter grade point average improved 4 points to a new high. Also a weekly



study hall was created for pledges, a minimum mid-term grade level was established for brothers and pledges, text book gift certificates were allocated for academic award winners, and a new exam file was created as a study resource for brothers and pledges.

With these and other academic improvements, the chapter is now a leading scholastic as well as social chapter.

ALUMNI BOARD ACTIVITY

The present Alumni Board Inc. of Connecticut Alpha is working harder and becoming more involved in the chapter than ever before. This reflects the trend of all our recent alumni becoming more enthused about and interested in the undergraduate chapter.
