Once again, a large turn-out of alums, families, and guests is expected at the annual Yale Bowl tailgate party, featuring the year's premier football dogfight between the UConn Huskies and the Bulldogs of Yale.

Sigma Phi Epsilon remains the place to be this year for a good time both outside and inside the stadium. Tickets have been pre-purchased in a reserved block of one hundred (another hundred may be added if demands require), so get set to bring friends and family and relive some old and not so old times and enjoy a fourth consecutive Husky victory.

As in past years, both Yale and UConn authorities have increased restrictions at the Yale Bowl. Although these new policies have a minimal effect on our enjoyment of the game, an awareness of these regulations is important to a successful alumni get together.

- * We will be meeting in parking lot C, located directly below previous years' lot D. Lot C has been designated a reserve "group tailgating" lot. The pre-purchased block of one hundred game tickets reserves a portion of the lot for our tailgate. This entitles us to a maximum of fifty car spaces in the lot. At least one person in each car must have a reserved lot ticket to gain entrance to the lot.
- * As in past years, Sigma Phi Epsilon will be supplying plenty of food and non-alcoholic beverages. Please bring your own alcohol.
- * No keg beer will be allowed in any Yale Bowl parking lot.
- * Tickets can be reserved by calling Ed Kaplan at (203)-747-0113 (24 hour answering machine ticket service). Tickets cost 10 dollars and can be picked up before September 29, but will also be available for those alums reserving them at the lot en-

trance from 8 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on game day. Look for a brother wearing the Sig Ep letters at the lot gate!.

- * If we receive over one hundred orders we will call you back immediately to inform you of this development.
- * The gates to the lot open at 8 a.m. At 11:30 the lot will be opened to the general ticketed public regardless of reserved ticket status on a first-come basis. So if you want one of the fifty parking spots Sig Ep has reserved, get there as early as you can! Kickoff is at 1:00 pm.
- * Lot D, last year's lot, is now designated an "alcohol free" lot, so even if you intend only to park there and join us in lot C, you'll have to leave any alcohol outside. Lots F and B are allowed alcohol and are opened to individual parkers. If parking in lot C becomes a problem, we recommend parking in lots F or B and walking over to our tailgate.
- * Once safe in lot C, look for the Sig Ep entourage and our chapter flag. For a non-visual cue to our location in the lot you can listen for the familiar sounds of the SABBS Band drifting over the crowd.

In order to keep the tailgate tradition alive, Connecticut Alpha requests your support. Purchasing your tickets from the chapter will only add to the Yale Bowl experience. A hundred-strong block of Sig Eps and guests in the stadium cannot fail to generate excitement and attract attention. 
