

Connecticut Alpha Alumni Board of Directors elections were held on September 14, and new officers include:





UNDERGRADUATE UPDATE



SIG EP'S FIRST RENAISSANCE INITIATE DEAD AT 79




Admiral Elmo R. Zumwalt (shown left with then Sigma Phi Epsilon Educational Foundation Chairman Bill Schreyer, Penn State '55) was the Fraternity's first "Renaissance of Brotherhood" initiate. Connecticut Alpha was given the honor of initiating Admiral Zumwalt on behalf of the entire Fraternity in 1987. Given credit for modernizing the Navy after the Korean War, he led the Navy effort in the Vietnam War. He died after a brief illness.










